#### 2024 Premier's Reading Challenge

Dear Parents/Carers,

This year all classes across K-6 will be given the opportunity to participate in the 2024 Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). The Challenge involves students reading selected books from the PRC list.

For <u>K-2 students</u>, the Challenge will involve the Teacher Librarian reading 20 books from the PRC list and 10 personal choice books within Library classes.



For <u>3-6 students</u>, the Challenge will involve students reading 10 books from the PRC list and 10 personal choice books at home.

Once students have read their PRC book, they need to complete their Personal Reading Log (PRL). The PRL helps students track their progress, and is used to prepare student's PRC Certificates. Once K-2 classes have read the nominated PRC text, the text will then be added to the classes' PRL, which will be kept in a folder in the library. For primary students, their PRL should be kept at home in a safe place, until the record is complete and students are ready to log their reading texts. Students who are interested will need to see Miss Taylor to collect their PRL.

The Challenge will open to our school on Monday, February 26th, 2024, and close on close on Friday, August 23rd, 2024, to prepare for certificates.

The children who have participated and completed the reading requirements will receive a Challenge Completion Certificate from the NSW Premier at the end of the year.

There is no cost involved.
